AFTRS/ABC Selwyn Graduate Diploma **Speight Diversity** Radio Scholarship

Purpose

The purpose of this scholarship is to expand and enrich the school's student community by recognising and supporting an outstanding Graduate Diploma in Radio and Podcasting student, selected on the basis of excellence from eligible students from diverse backgrounds.

Diversity refers to the differences that distinguish groups of people from one another. People manifest differences through attributes such as culture, religion, language, gender, age, disability, educational disadvantage, socioeconomic status, or sexual orientation. This is not an exhaustive list of diversity groups; and individuals may identify as belonging to one or a number of these groups.

The AFTRS/ABC Selwyn Speight Excellence Scholarship for the Graduate Diploma in Radio and Podcasting is awarded to support and develop the career of the recipient, providing them with a minimum \$15,000 scholarship (final amount to be determined by the Trustee), an unpaid internship at the ABC throughout the study year followed by a 12 month employment contract if all performance measures are met.

The scholarship is intended to support students by providing contribution to a living allowance or towards relocation costs, study resources and other costs. One scholarship may be offered in 2022 to a Graduate Diploma in Radio and Podcasting student after consideration by the selection committee. The recipient cannot defer the commencement of the scholarship.

Payments

The scholarship is made available via a beguest from the late Selwyn Speight, who was an ABC journalist. The 2022 scholarship is valued at a minimum of \$15,000 to be paid to the scholarship recipient following the applicable census date.

Assessment of applications

The scholarship is intended to recognise both diversity and excellence, and applications will be assessed on those grounds.

AFTRS will determine excellence on the basis of the selection process applied to all Graduate Diploma in Radio and Podcasting applicants.

The committee will take into consideration the personal statement provided by the applicant in regards to their background. Applicants are asked to self-identify when making an application, but may be required to supply documentation relating to their membership of a target group on request.

There is one scholarship available, competitively determined on consideration of the application ranking of candidates who fulfil the eligibility criteria. AFTRS and the ABC will determine which, if any, applicant will be awarded the scholarship. AFTRS' decision is final and no correspondence about decisions will be entered into. Successful applicants will be told of any conditions of the scholarship.

Who can apply?

To be eligible to apply, you must:

- Be an applicant for, or have accepted a position in, the 2022 Graduate Diploma in Radio and Podcasting full-time or part-time
- Be an Australian citizen or Australian permanent resident or a New Zealand citizen; and
- Identify as being from a diverse background

How to Apply

Application dates

- Applications open Monday 19 July 2021 and close Monday 8 November 2021.
- Supporting documents must be submitted to AFTRS by the closing date. You will be notified by email whether or not your application is successful.

Application form

To be eligible for this scholarship, you must have been offered a place in the Graduate Diploma in Radio and Podcasting full time or part-time course, so it is important that you apply for the course as well as apply for the scholarship. Complete the online scholarship application form and provide any documentation requested by the closing date.

Application Task

1. Produce and record items

Please submit a 5 minute (maximum) radio interview with someone about modern Australian identity. We want to hear how you ask questions, and how you listen and respond to the interviewee, to tell a story. (submit as an MP3).

All audio can be recorded on any device/s, including smart phones. *Podcasts should identify an audience, station or brand that the content would appeal to if submitting an original concept.

2. Upload a copy of your current CV.

Applicants will be shortlisted based on their application task and resume. Shortlisted applicants will attend an interview.

 You will be required to provide a statement regarding your background and the diversity group/s that you identify as belonging to.

Other information

In assessing your application, the committee may request you provide additional supporting documents to enable them to make a final decision. You will be contacted via email to request specified documents if required.

Certification of documentation provided

Any documents you provide as support material must be certified copies. AFTRS' certification requirements are available at:

Translation of documents provided

If supporting documents are not in English, applicants are required to supply certified copies of the following:

- The document in the original language; and
- An English translation of the document by an accredited translator. Do not send original supporting documents.
