

AFTRS 2022 Honorary Degree Nomination Form

The AFTRS Honorary Degree is awarded in recognition of individuals who have made an outstanding contribution to the screen or broadcast industries in Australia or overseas. The Honorary Degree is awarded to honour exceptional achievement in these industries including creative leadership, craft excellence and innovation.

Focus Area: Courage and Community

Drawing inspiration from two of the organisation's new values, *Courage* and *Community*, AFTRS is calling for honorary degree nominations that embody these traits. Nominations will represent those that exhibit a curious, resilient and open-hearted perseverance along with a propensity for working together with respect, responsibility and a recognition that our strength comes from inclusivity and shared accountability.

The recipient will have made a significant, positive and demonstrable impact on Australian life and culture through their work in the screen, broadcast or education industries. This impact can include, but is not limited to, issues of First Nations human rights and perspectives, equity and the environment. We encourage nominations that recognise individuals who belong to underrepresented groups.

Nomination Guidelines

- 1. No more than two nominations can be made by the same nominator.
- 2. Nominees should not be informed that they have been put forward to be considered for the Honorary Degree until or unless they are successful. Nominators should not solicit letters of support on behalf of their nominee.
- 3. You must include a detailed biography, resume, CV or list of achievements. Screen and broadcast industry nominations should include details of any media credits and published work.
- 4. Individuals employed by AFTRS are not eligible for nomination. Ex-staff members are eligible for consideration after five years from having completed their employment at AFTRS.
- 5. A nominee does not need to have a higher education degree, including a degree from AFTRS, to be considered for the Honorary Degree.
- 6. Nominations are considered by the Honorary Degree Committee before being recommended through to AFTRS Council for decision. While the Honorary Degree may be awarded annually, the Committee may choose not to award the degree in a particular year if they consider that those nominated do not meet the selection criteria.
- 7. The nomination and selection process is as per the Honorary Degree Policy and Procedure, which is available on the <u>Corporate Documents</u> section of AFTRS website.

The closing date and process for nomination submission is at the end of this nomination form.

Criteria 2 – Positive Impact in relation to Produced Work The nominee has a transformative impact on social and cultural life through the screen, audio or broadcast content they have made; this could be through working practices, improving access and opportunities in the industry, or through on-screen representation, themes and narratives.
Criteria 3 – Leadership Through their leadership, the nominee has championed work that has led to positive change at a local, state, national and/or international levels. This change could include, but is not limited to, creative vision, advocacy, mentoring & training and involvement in government committees or reviews.
