Welcome to the Jerzy Toeplitz Library

The Jerzy Toeplitz Library is recognised as Australia's leading library for learning, teaching, research, creativity and innovation of the screen arts and broadcasting industries, and was established in 1973 and named after the founding director of AFTRS, Professor Jerzy Toeplitz (1909-1995).

Our library boasts an extensive and unique collection of items both on-premises and online. On-site, the library holds over 50,000 items, including over 18,000 DVDs and Blu-rays, 20,000 books and ebooks, 3,000 film and television scripts and screenplays, and every AFTRS student film ever made, as well as the special Bill Collins Collection with over 20,000 books donated by the Australian film critic. Online, there are over 75,000 streaming videos. The growing collection, which includes many rare and hard-to-find items, is regularly showcased through rotating displays.

In addition to being a place for quiet study, the library hosts educational workshops, public talks and film screenings. The library is staffed by experienced information professionals, who support and empower the staff and students of AFTRS and the film and broadcasting industry, to shape and share their stories.

The Program

The AFTRS Library Presents 50th Anniversary Screening program is a celebration of feature films that have been made by AFTRS Alumni. In the last 50 years, the school has produced many talented filmmakers that have been at the forefront of cinema culture, producing work that has moved, challenged and thrilled audiences around the world. AFTRS Alumni have had their work screened at countless major International Film Festivals, as well as going on to win Academy Awards, AACTAs, BAFTAs, Golden Globes, Emmys and hundreds of guild prizes.

This program shines a spotlight on the wonderful legacy of our screen practitioners, whose work continues to inspire. Each film in this series was Directed by an AFTRS Alumni, and almost all of them feature Alumni in key creative roles including Producers, Cinematographers, Editors, Production and Costume Designers.

In partnership with the National Film and Sound Archive (NFSA), the films in this program will be presented entirely on 35mm prints borrowed from their collection, treating audiences to a rich and unique cinematic experience.

The National Film and Sound Archive of Australia

As the custodian of Australia's national audiovisual collection, the National Film and Sound Archive of Australia (NFSA) proudly upholds the responsibility entrusted to us by the Australian public to collect, preserve and share the nation's vibrant and diverse audiovisual culture. Audiovisual technologies enable us to capture moments in time: moving image and sounds in their most vivid forms. At over four million items, the NFSA collection transforms these records into 'living memories' reflecting who we were, who we are, and who we want to be.

In recent times, there has been an explosion in new forms of creation. We are adapting to ensure the collection reflects the breadth of modern audiovisual creation in all its complexity. For example, in addition to film, television and sound production, we now collect video games and interactive media – embracing the technical and philosophical challenges these present.

The NFSA's ability to build, share and safeguard the national collection relies on the depth of our in-house expertise, coupled with the strength of the relationships we have with individual creators, industry, research communities and the cultural and education sectors. Respecting the rights of creators and other third-party rightsholders of material held in the collection is central to our work and is informed by relevant cultural and Intellectual Property rights frameworks.

The NFSA values its long association and collaboration with AFTRS. The work of many of the school's alumni is held in the national collection and we are delighted to provide access to several films for this special 50th anniversary screening program. Congratulations on a remarkable five decades of creativity, innovation and achievement! We look forward to seeing what AFTRS, your current students, and AFTRS alumni do next.
