# AFTRS First Nations Scholarships

## Purpose

AFTRS First Nations Scholarships are awarded on the basis of creative excellence or equity.

The scholarships are intended to assist Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander, with the costs associated with higher education at AFTRS.

## Payments

AFTRS' fund for the scholarships is managed through the First Nations and Outreach team and overseen by the CEO.

AFTRS may give support for a range of purposes associated with a course.

For example, AFTRS may contribute towards relocation costs, study resources and other costs, at the school's discretion.

The amount of annual support may vary, between:

- Up to \$7,500 for the Bachelor of Arts Screen: Production;
- Up to \$12,500, for the Graduate Diploma in Radio & Podcasting (full time);
- Up to \$6,500 for the Graduate Diploma in Radio & Podcasting (part time), per year;
- Up to \$25,000 for Master of Arts Screen; and
- Up to \$12,500 for Master of Arts Screen: Business, depending on a student's individual circumstances.

In exceptional circumstances, higher financial support may be given.

Payments will be made pro rata according to study load.

Payments will be made each semester in equal instalments.

Generally, payments will be made after all applicable census dates have passed and are conditional on the student remaining enrolled, in good academic standing, and continuing to meet the eligibility criteria and any other conditions.

## Assessment of Applications

There are limited funds for scholarships, so AFTRS may not be able to support everyone who applies.

AFTRS will determine which, if any, applicants will be awarded a scholarship. AFTRS' decision is final and no correspondence about decisions will be entered into.

Successful applicants will be told of any conditions of a scholarship.

All applications will be treated confidentially.

## Who can apply?

This scholarship is open to both new and continuing students.

To be eligible to apply, you must:

- Identify as an Australian Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander person and be accepted as such within your community
- Be an Australian citizen or Australian permanent resident or a New Zealand citizen
- Be an applicant or have accepted a position in the Bachelor of Arts Screen: Production, Graduate Diploma of Radio & Podcasting full time or part time, Master of Arts Screen or Master of Arts Screen: Business
- Show you are in need of financial assistance to meet the costs associated with studying at AFTRS OR show significant creative excellence and how your career aspirations would benefit
- Show you would be likely to complete the course

# How to Apply

## Application dates

Round 1 applications open Tuesday 20 June 2023 and close:

- Master of Arts Screen Tuesday 7 November 2023.
- Bachelor of Arts Screen: Production Monday 23 October 2023.
- Master of Arts Screen: Business Monday 23 October 2023.
- Graduate Diploma in Radio & Podcasting (full time or part time) Tuesday 14 November 2023.

Applications may, however, be accepted outside these dates. If you wish to do this, you are encouraged to contact the First Nations and Outreach team before applying.

Supporting documents must be submitted to AFTRS by the closing date. You will be notified by email whether or not your application is successful.

## How to apply

1. Complete the ONLINE application form and upload supporting documents
2. You must give AFTRS:
  - a) A confirmation of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent form executed by an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander organisation with a common seal.
  - b) A statement describing the opportunity the scholarship would give you
  - c) A statement declaring any other financial help you are getting to study in 2024 including Centrelink payments such as ABSTUDY
  - d) If applying on the basis of financial need and/or other educational disadvantage: proof of real and enduring financial need. This may be proof you receive or will receive a means tested Australian government income support payment like Centrelink ABSTUDY. You may also give proof of other circumstances that may affect your education such as any carer responsibilities, sole parent responsibilities, longterm medical condition or disability or ongoing effects of abuse, or regional or remote disadvantage
  - e) If applying on the basis of significant creative excellence and career aspirations: Provide works of distinctive and creative storytelling for assessment and a letter of support from a screen or broadcast industry stakeholder or an experienced screen or broadcast practitioner.
